<p>3 Presentation by John Gilbert, Training Package Project Specialist, TLISC</p> <p>John gave an overview of the TLISC role and changes to the TLI07 training package. These included changes to the Diploma/Certificate IV Logistics and the fatigue management units. He also discussed licencing units and the COAG initiative, as well as the Diploma of Material Logistics and Diploma of Operational Logistics.</p> <p>The proposed qualification framework for the driver qualification was introduced with relevant handouts (see coversheet 2, 3, 4 attached) which has a number of streams for different types of drivers. Up to now and due to funding requirements, many drivers have been trained up to Certificate III level, regardless of their job level, whereas the job may not necessarily be at that level.
