

Our Activities

The LTC provides a link between the transport, logistics and wholesale industries and the training system. In collaboration with national skills councils and training providers, the LTC identifies industry training requirements and develops programs to meet the skills needs of enterprises. This involves:

- Consulting with industry and other stakeholders on training issues such as identifying barriers and solutions to increasing the number of apprentices and trainees.
- Formation of a state wide workforce development strategy for industry skills
- Recommending training strategies to support industries' skills development needs.
- Conducting surveys to ascertain training needs and using the intelligence in workforce development planning.
- Promoting both new and existing worker traineeships throughout Western Australia.
- Supporting VET in schools to align with local employment opportunities.
- Working with private training providers to identify industry training needs and opportunities.
- Focusing on the training needs of the regions as follows:
 - Gascoyne, Goldfields/Esperance, Great Southern, Kimberley, Midwest, Peel, Pilbara, South West, Wheatbelt.
