Have your Say about the Proposed Heavy Vehicle National Law

The National Transport Commission and the National Heavy Vehicle Regulator Project Office are holding Heavy Vehicle National Law Information Forums throughout Australia during March and April.

The forums will provide an overview of the key aspects of the proposed Draft Heavy Vehicle National Laws and accompanying Regulatory Impact Statement (RIS) which was publically released on 28 February 2011. They will also explore how the National Heavy Vehicle Regulator will operate and provide participants with an opportunity to ask questions and have their say.

The award categories are:

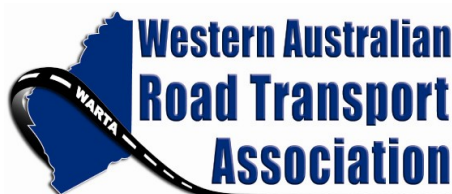
- Outstanding Contribution to the Australian Trucking Industry

TLISC—New Training Package TL110

The new TL110 Transport and Logistics Training Package which replaces TL107 has now been released on NTIS. www.ntis.gov.au/Default.aspx?/trainingpackage/TL110 The main change to the training package is the complete recoding of all units and qualifications and the addition of new rail qualifications. Please see training package for mapping information.

Hours for the new units are in the process of being allocated and RTOs will be advised when the new purchasing guide is available. RTOs will need to submit an application to the Training Accreditation Council to amend their scope. If they are adding new units they will also need to justify these units.
