- **Skill Gap** – a new Training Needs Analysis tool has been developed for companies to use in identifying training needs gaps; it is now accessible at: www.tlisc.com.au.
- **Competency Skills Builder for Road Transport and Warehousing** – an electronic resource is being designed to assist companies in selecting Units of Competency for the purpose of developing training plans; it is due for completion in June 2010. Industry representatives are invited to express interest in participating in trials by emailing Robyn Stepnell via the email address above.
- **Maritime Training Resources** – a package of integrated learning resources is being created for use by Maritime trainees, and is due for completion by June 2010.

TLISC Update - Activity 2009

- **Environmental Sustainability Industry Response** – The 11 Industry Skills Councils have prepared a response to the question of environmental sustainability: Environmental sustainability requires the design and provision of products and services that incorporate and promote waste minimisation and the efficient and effective use and reuse of resources. - **National Training Package Website** – The new system was scheduled to become available 29 September 2009, and the timeframe has now been extended. Training Package Update - Activity for 2009 and beyond

- **Revision of Qualification Structure** – work is occurring on alignment of job roles with qualifications, in accordance with the DEEWR requirement.
- **Rationalization** – dialogue is continuing between Industry Skills Councils regarding achievement of greater use of shared units across industries.
- During 2010, a review of TLI07 Units of Competency will be undertaken, and consideration will be given to: updating existing units, retiring any obsolete units, and development of new units.

Training Package Update - Activity for 2009 and beyond

- **Continuous Improvement** – Since 2008 Training Packages have moved on from a fixed three year review cycle to a process of continuous improvement, in order to more swiftly reflect industry practice and skill requirements.
- Updates and changes to Training Packages for 2009 are underway, and the annual schedule for submission to the National Quality Council is:
 - April – AVI Aviation Training Package
 - July – TDM Maritime Training Package
 - October - TLI Transport & Logistics Training Package

- Amended AQF alignment for TLIF6307A Administer the implementation of fatigue management strategies (AQF 3), and TLIF6407A Manage fatigue management policy and procedures (AQF 4)
- Amended packaging rule for Diploma of Logistics - Requires 14 units: being at least 10 and up to 14 at AQF 5 from list, up to 2 at AQF 4 from this TP, up to 4 at AQF 5 from this or other TP, up to 2 at AQF 6 from this TP)

- Note: The *National Standard for Licensing Persons Performing High Risk Work (April 2006)* requires training and assessment for high risk work licences to occur within the vocational education and training system. An additional 12 High Risk Licensing Units have also been incorporated into the CPC08 Construction, Plumbing and Services Integrated Framework Training Package, and a further two units will be contained in the UEP06 Electricity Supply Industry – Generation Sector Training Package. 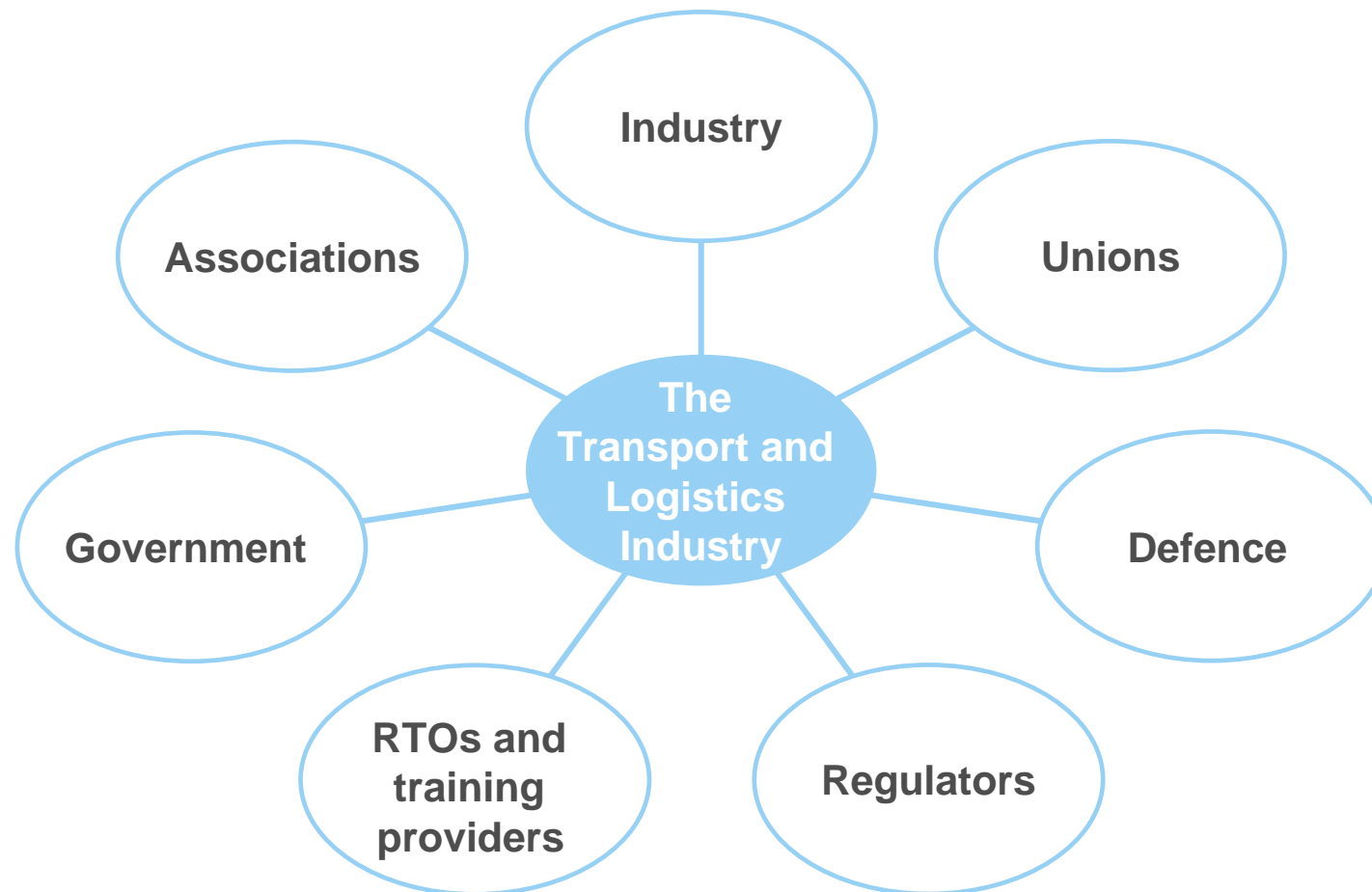
In November 2008 Australian Maritime Safety Authority released information regarding restructure of maritime training and certification. This reform has been under consideration for some time and aims to have a new structure in place by the end of 2009. The 'Tinny to Tanker' (T2T) certification system will address existing impediments to training and career pathways for the industry.
